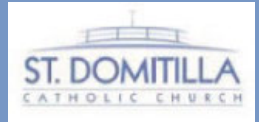

Pastor's Column/Carta del Párroco

"Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather emptied himself, taking the form of a slave...humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death." Philippians 2:6-8. These words found in the Letter to the Philippians, our second reading this Sunday, describe Jesus' action on Passion Sunday. This is called: the "*Kenosis*" of the Son of God. *Kenosis is a word from Greek that means "emptying" or "self-emptying" which refers to God's incarnation, humiliation and death. Without renouncing his status as Son of God, Our Lord put behind his divine prerogatives in order to embrace humanity at its fullness. That way Jesus embraced the perplexities, wonders and sufferings of human life to exalt human life with himself to the glory of God.*

On Passion (Palm) Sunday, we walk alongside Jesus' kenosis, his total self-emptying. With palms still fresh from proclaiming Him the Son of David, we witness his agony, trial and death. We experience what God is capable of doing for us.

Jesus was subjected to injustice, abandonment, isolation and pain, situations still too common for many today. He is, therefore, in solidarity with the suffering and forgotten, as we must be. The Gospel speaks today of the togetherness with God and with all the human race. In our present challenges in a world torn by wars, violence, misunderstanding and poverty, we realize how together and dependent we are on one another. More than ever before, we are aware that anyone's well being is interrelated to the well being of others, near or far.

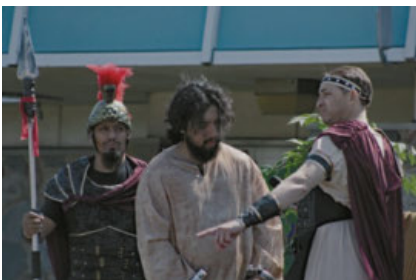
The Lord died on the cross for each and every one of us to whom He gives his life and resurrection. Since it is divine life, it overcomes death, sin, injustice and the neglect of our sisters and brothers. That's why the Cross is the lasting sign of Jesus' kenosis and his togetherness. It is a reminder that our God is in no way distant to our suffering, he embraces the shortcomings and ambiguities of human life together with us. Thus, in many human moments we may not have answers, strength, or even hope, but we have Him. He has given himself to you and me without reservation and holding absolutely nothing back.

"Cristo, siendo Dios, no consideró que debía aferrarse a las prerrogativas de su condición divina, sino que al contrario, se anonadó a sí mismo tomando la condición de siervo... se humilló y aceptó incluso la muerte". Filipenses 2: 6-8. Estas palabras de la Carta a los Filipenses, la segunda lectura, describen lo que hace Jesús en el Domingo de la Pasión. En teología, a esto le llamamos: "*Kenosis*" del Hijo de Dios. *Kenosis es una palabra de origen griego que significa "vaciar" o "autovaciar" refiriéndose en este caso a la encarnación, humillación y muerte del Hijo de Dios. Sin renunciar a su condición de divina, Nuestro Señor dejó atrás sus privilegios divinos para asumir la condición humana en su plenitud. De esta manera, Jesús asumió el esplendor, el misterio y los sufrimientos de la vida humana, y la exaltó junto a Él para la gloria de Dios.*

En el Domingo de la Pasión (Domingo de Ramos) contemplamos la kenosis de Jesús, su vaciamiento total de sí mismo. Con los Ramos aún frescos por haberlo proclamado Rey e Hijo de David, presenciamos su agonía, juicio y muerte. Así experimentamos lo que Dios es capaz de hacer por nosotros.

Jesús fue sometido a injusticia, abandono, aislamiento y dolor, situaciones aún demasiado comunes para muchos hoy en día. Por lo tanto, Él está unido en solidaridad con los que sufren y son olvidados, como también debemos estarlo nosotros. El Evangelio nos habla hoy de la unión con Dios y con toda la humanidad. En nuestros desafíos actuales en un mundo desgarrado por guerras, violencia, malentendidos y pobreza, nos damos cuenta de cuán juntos e interdependientes somos los unos de los otros. Más que nunca, somos conscientes de que el bienestar de cualquier persona está relacionado con el bienestar de los demás, cercanos o lejanos.

El Señor murió en la cruz por todos y cada uno de nosotros a quienes Él mismo da su propia vida y resurrección. Esa vida, al ser divina, supera la muerte, el pecado, la injusticia y la indiferencia. Es por eso que la Cruz es el signo de la *kenosis- el vaciamiento y entrega de Jesús y de su unión con nosotros. Es un recordatorio de que nuestro Dios no está lejos de nuestro sufrimiento, sino que enfrenta las debilidades y la ambigüedad de la vida humana junto a nosotros. Por lo tanto, en muchos momentos tan humanos puede ser que no tengamos respuestas, fortaleza o incluso esperanza, pero lo tenemos a Él. Se ha entregado a ti y a mí sin reservas, vaciando su vida en nosotros sin medida.*

Why is it important to be a registered parishioner?

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. People think just because they attend a certain mass they automatically belong to that parish. Young adults who were registered under their parents may think they are still registered in that parish. Membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish.

Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of the parish. It is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of our parish.

Registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese and how many Masses, confessions and devotions are planned and scheduled.

Being a registered parishioner also helps when you are in the need of:

- Scheduling sacraments
- When someone asks you to sponsor or be a godparent for a child receiving the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, or First Communion.
- When you want to Baptize in another church and you need the authorization from your home Parish.
- You can also present the record of your support and contributions for tax purposes every year: they are tax deductible.

When you are registered in a church parish, your financial support and contributions you make every Sunday can be recorded in the parish file when you use your personal envelopes. Your support to your parish turns you into an "Active Parishioner" - it also helps the Pastor to identify easily if you are attending your Sunday Masses and supporting your church community.

If we have no records of you in our system, we will not be able to serve you as we would like and as you deserve. All your personal information is confidential and will not be given out or shared with any third parties.

If you would like to register at this time, please see one of the ushers for a census form to fill out and return in the collection basket or to the parish office. You can also stop in the parish office to fill out the form.

If you contribute through GiveCentral, you still need to register to become an Active Parishioner. Our census numbers are taken from our parish system. You will be assigned a parishioner number but will not receive envelopes unless you request them.

We are called to be good stewards. Get Registered and become an integral part of Queen of All Nations Parish.

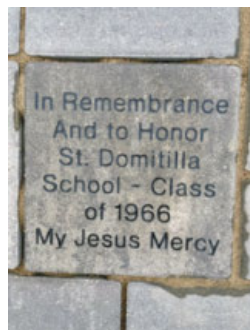
All lines will be centered. Spaces and punctuation count as characters. Symbols take 4 characters.
